Workers' Voice & Labor

Increasing Minimum Wage: <u>Supports</u> \$15-per-hour minimum wage to protect low-wage workers.

Strengthening Unions & Workers: <u>Proposes</u> requiring corporations to show they are not engaged in pay discrimination, imposing a fine on those that fail to close their pay gaps by requiring they pay 1 percent of their profits for every 1 percent wage gap they allow to persist, and requiring companies to disclose whether they are "equal pay certified" on their websites.

Labor Law Reform: Co-sponsored the Family and Medical Insurance Act in 2017 and 2019 to provide workers with up to 12 weeks of paid family and medical leave.

Education

Public Education: <u>Proposes</u> to make the largest federal investment in teacher pay and close the teacher pay gap during her first term; the average public school teacher will be given a \$13,500 raise. Also <u>supports</u> legislation to "provide qualifying teachers with a new, incremental loan-cancellation program."

Early Education: <u>Proposes</u> increasing the federal government's investment in child care to ensure working families do not pay more than 7 percent of their income on child care.

College Affordability: <u>Proposes</u> allowing student debt-holders to refinance to lower interest rates, ensuring "no student pays more than they can afford and cracking down on for-profit colleges."

Freedom to Teach & Student Testing: <u>Proposes</u> narrowing the race and gender pay disparities to lift up women teachers of color.

Teachers Strikes: <u>Stated</u> she "unequivocally stand[s] with the teachers striking ... and hope[s] for a quick resolution."

Vouchers & Privatization: Opposes private school vouchers and cited vouchers as a reason for opposing DeVos' nomination for secretary of education.

Healthcare & Workplace Safety

"Medicare for All": <u>Proposes</u> guaranteeing Medicare for All in order to eliminate premiums and out-of-pocket costs; ensuring comprehensive care, including dental and vision; and ensuring people are not denied services or doctor choice.

Affordable Care Act: <u>Proposes</u> people will have the ability to immediately buy in to Medicare, with a 10-year phase-in period.

Public Option: Proposes keeping a public option during the 10-year transition period and then moving into a single-payer system.

Prescription Drug Costs: <u>Proposes</u> setting a fair price for all prescription drugs, and taxing pharmaceutical companies above the fair price at 100 percent. As <u>attorney general</u>, she won a more than \$320 million settlement from insurance companies that defrauded Californians.

Opioid Epidemic: <u>Proposes</u> prosecuting those profiting from the health crisis they have helped cause.

Gun Violence Reform: <u>Proposes</u> mandating near-universal background checks, closing the "boyfriend loophole," and banning assault weapons.

Jobs & the Economy

Trump's Tax Cuts for the Wealthy: <u>Proposes</u> reversing Trump's tax cuts for the wealthy and redistributing them as a tax credit of up to \$6,000 to working families each year. As state attorney general, she fought Wall Street and <u>won \$20 billion</u> for California homeowners harmed by the foreclosure crisis.

Rural America: <u>Proposes</u> offering loan forgiveness for rural healthcare professionals, <u>providing</u> aid to rural families to upgrade and maintain their water and septic systems, and accelerating the deployment of clean energy to rural areas.

Social Security: Opposes privatization, and supported a bill to expand Social Security benefits and strengthen the retirement program by increasing benefits by about \$1,342 a year for seniors now making less than \$16,000 annually and increasing cost-of-living adjustments.

Infrastructure: <u>Proposes</u> modernizing our transportation, energy and water infrastructure by making bold investments in innovative technologies to build a carbon-free future.

Democracy

Voting Rights: <u>Proposes</u> to restore the full protections of the Voting Rights Act and make Election Day a national holiday.

Citizens United: <u>Proposes</u> requiring public disclosure of donors by dark-money interest groups and appointing Supreme Court justices who prioritize Americans' right to vote over corporations' desire to buy elections.

Immigration & DACA: <u>Supports</u> a path to citizenship for immigrants, supports Dreamers, supports eliminating barriers, and opposes family separation.

Civil Rights: <u>Proposes</u> passing the Equality Act, putting a third gender option on federal identification cards and documents, and <u>ending the use of</u> private prisons.
