Worksite Leaders Training

This 4-part training program is geared for new worksite leaders such as new union stewards, new site representatives, and new building representatives. Trainings can be hosted by local unions for their own worksite leaders or coordinated by CFT Field Representatives for local unions in their region. The CFT also conducts a train-the-trainer program to prepare local union leaders to deliver this training. Talk to your CFT Field Representative if your local union would like to provide this 4-part training for your worksite leaders or to participate in a train-the-trainer session.
